Highlights

- This study examines the effects of separating from the first job within the first 5 years on later life outcomes.
- The effects of early job separation on economic and demographic outcomes are, in general, negative and long-lasting for males.
- The negative effects of early job separation on later life outcomes may be more serious for those who separated earlier.
