#### Highlights:

- The direct social origin effect is stable over historical and biographical time
- Career mobility is stronger in the Netherlands compared to Italy
- The intragenerational stability of the direct effect is the result of contrasting mechanisms
- Social origin plays a role beyond the first job entry in both countries
- The direct effect would decrease without the role that social origin plays over the career

#### 1. Introduction

A noteworthy result of intergenerational social mobility research is that social origin strongly influences occupational destinations, and that a large part of this gross effect is mediated by educational attainment. Still, several studies pointed out that social origin plays a substantive role
