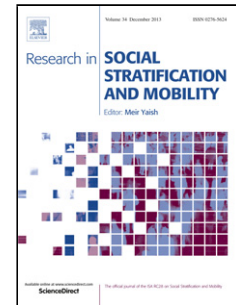

(Abstract)

Previous studies on the household registration system (*hukou*) have focused either on the selective process of *hukou* conversion to urban status and its impact on social stratification or on the socioeconomic disadvantages and the assimilation of rural migrant workers in cities.
