Highlights

- In this treatment sample, onset of opioid use occurred during late adolescence.
- Transitions to opioid dependence and treatment-seeking occurred in early adulthood.
- Birth cohort, child maltreatment and later use predicted rapid onset of dependence.
- <10 years school, depression and alcohol dependence predicted treatment delay.
- Mid-adolescence is a critical period for targeting interventions.
