Highlights

- Opioid users were more gun-involved than those with alcohol use disorder.
- More than half of opioid users reported being present when shots were fired.
- About one-third of opioid users owned a gun, carried a gun or had been shot at.
- Male opioid users reported greater gun involvement than females.
- Past incarceration and poorer self-control were associated with gun involvement.
