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Title: Police Officer Attitudes towards Intranasal Naloxone Training

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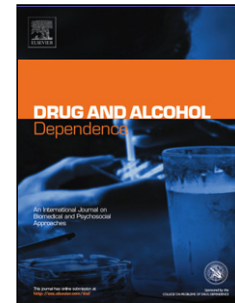
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Highlights

- Administered a survey to police officers following intranasal naloxone training.
- Most officers had been at the scene of more than one overdose in the past year.
- Survey responses suggest that officers had positive attitudes regarding naloxone training and feel that other police officers should be trained.
- Opioid Overdose Attitudes Scale (OOAS) items were included in the survey and showed high internal consistency.
- Officers who had the most experience with overdose felt more competent and concerned following training than those with less experience.

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
