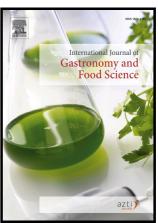
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SEAFOOD SAFETY AT HOME: KNOWLEDGE AND PRACTICES

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Abstract

Important part of foodborne diseases is related to improper preparation practices in home

kitchen. Global concern about food safety has prompted research to evaluate domestic food-

handling practices and food safety knowledge. In this study, knowledge of Turkish consumers'

(n=1000) on food safety were surveyed, as well as their food handling practices at home, via

street interviews. The participants were questioned as "do you cook at home?" and surveys

applied to the positive responders. The survey was focused on seafood, since it is a high-risk

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
