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# Assessment of social dimension of a jar of hone y: a methodological

11	Abstract
12	Honey is a natural sweetener that requires minimal industrial technologies and is the subject of thriving markets along with
13	its derived products. It has been estimated that about 35% of food consumption depends directly on the pollination of fruit
14	and vegetable crops. A Social Life Cycle Assessment (S-LCA) case-study is applied in the agro-food sector to assess the
15	social and socio-economic aspects of the life cycle of honey through the Subcategory Assessment Method (SAM). The
16	objectives of this paper are three-fold: i) evaluate the capability of S-LCA to capture the complexity of a multifunctional
17	product, which delivers fundamental ecosystem services with consequences at environmental, economic and social levels; iii
18	identify how to define and represent, with robust indicators, the positive social aspects generated by honey life cycle; iii)
19	identify the steps to improve the S-LCA methodology, especially for its application to complex product systems, such as the
20	agri-food ones. This paper presents a methodological framework to support decision makers in order to evaluate the social
21	sustainability of the Italian honey sector. The presence of positive social aspects in the life cycle of a jar of honey was
22	highlighted as well as a strong connection between the honey product and local community. Furthermore, a weak relation
23	between suppliers along the entire supply chain emerged. The findings lead to the conclusion that further developments are
24	required in order to improve the assessment of the multifunctional product and to reinforce the awareness of the social
25	sustainability by starting from strong collaborations within the supply chain.
