

Abstract

Caring as a term in nursing, represents all factors used by nurses to provide health

services to patients. The aim of this study was to compare the differences of caring behaviors

as perceived by nurses, patients and nursing students and to explore the relationship between

sociodemographic variables and the perception of caring. This was a descriptive comparative

research study. Data were collected from August to September 2015 in Indonesia by using

Caring Behavior Inventory-42 composed of five domains: respect, assurance, connectedness,

knowledge and skills, and attentiveness. A total of 158 respondents were sought for three

study groups and each group had 53 respondents. Results indicated that nurses, patients and
