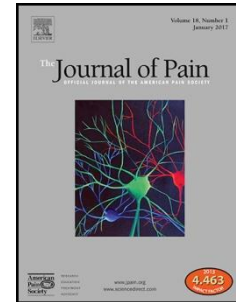

Highlights

- Fibromyalgia patients experience daily variability in pain, fatigue, and mood.
- Differences in pain and social functioning emerged across variability clusters.
- Targeting symptom variability may be an important clinical initiative.

Abstract

The current study examined between- and within-subject variability in pain-related symptoms as predictors of pain and fatigue, and identified patient subgroups based upon symptom variability characteristics. Two hundred and fifty-six fibromyalgia (FM) patients completed daily diaries up

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
