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Do out-of-pocket costs affect medication adherence in adults with rheumatoid arthritis? A systematic review

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Abstract

Introduction: Rheumatoid arthritis (RA) is a chronic inflammatory disease that often

requires long term treatment with multiple medications. However, medication nonadherence

can be a major problem in patients with RA, and with the introduction of biologic agents this

issue may intensify due to the high costs of these medications.

Objective: This systematic review aimed to determine whether out-of-pocket (OOP) costs

affect medication adherence in adults with RA.

Methods: Twelve databases were searched to identify primary peer-reviewed articles.

written in English from inception to April 2016 that referred to the relationship between

medication adherence and OOP costs. The CASP check list was used to assess the quality

rating of the included studies.

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
