25	A 23-year-old female patient with refractory chylous ascites was successfully
26	treated with laparoscopic ligation of the ruptured lymphatic vessel. The young patient
27	developed abdominal distention after right side pelvic lymph node dissection for
28	dysgerminoma of the right ovary. Conservative managements failed to control the
29	symptoms. Laparoscopic surgery was carried out after oral administration of peanut
30	oil, revealing the presence of a whitish fluid in the abdominal cavity. The responsible
