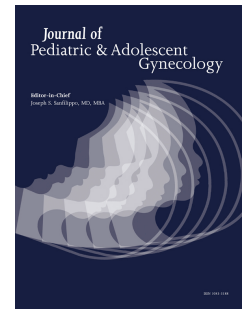


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Factors associated with contraceptive use differ between younger and older African-American female adolescents

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
