Award Winning Research Recognized



Abstract: One of the joys of the editorial team is selecting the annual Journal Awards. Recognizing research excellence is what we do. If a manuscript was ultimately selected for publication, it is already excellent, as we publish less than 20% of original scientific article submissions, and we received more than 1,300 such submissions in 2017. To be one of our award winners is to be truly "elite."

O ne of the joys of the editorial team is selecting the annual Journal Awards. Recognizing research excellence is what we do. If a manuscript was ultimately selected for publication, it is already excellent as it was one of the top 20% of our over 1300 submissions. To be one of our award winners is to be truly "elite."

The award finalists for Clinical Research, Basic Science Research, and Resident/Fellow Research were selected based on the quantitative rating assigned to each reviewed article by our reviewers, Editorial Board, and Associate Editors. Then, a Research Excellence Committee comprised of Associate Editors Tim Hunt, Darius Moezzi, and Josh Harris, along with Statistical Associate Editor Mark Cote, and Assistant-Editor-in-Chief Jeff Brand, selected the winners. The finalists and winners of the Most Cited Publications and Most Downloaded Publications were selected based on data reports provided by our publisher.

This year's winner of the Arthroscopy Journal Award for Clinical Research Excellence (drum roll please) is "Periarticular Injection Versus Femoral Nerve Block for Pain Relief After Anterior Cruciate Ligament Reconstruction: A Randomized Controlled Trial" authored by Kenji Kurosaka, Sachiyuki Tsukada, Hiroshi Nakayama, Tomoya Iseki, Ryo Kanto, Ryo Sugama, and Shinichi Yoshiya.¹ Congratulations to Associate Editor emeritus, Shinichi, and his team. Nonopioid management of postoperative pain is a very important and clinically relevant topic, particularly at the present time. Our other finalists are noted in Table 1.

The 2017 winner of the Arthroscopy award for Basic Science Excellence is "Effect of Footprint Preparation on Tendon-to-Bone Healing: A Histologic and Biomechanical Study in a Rat Rotator Cuff Repair Model" by Haruhiko Nakagawa, Toru Morihara, Hiroyoshi Fujiwara, Yukichi Kabuto, Tsuyoshi Sukenari, Yoshikazu Kida, Ryuhei Furukawa, Yuji Arai, Ken-ichi Matsuda, Mitsuhiro Kawata, Masaki Tanaka, and Toshikazu Kubo.⁶ Investigation of the influence of the host environment on tendon-to-bone healing contributes to our

understanding of biologics. The other finalists are listed in Table 2.

The winner of the 2017 award for Resident/Fellow Research Excellence is "Do Skin Lacerations Imply Tissue Transfer from Surgeon to Patient During Arthroscopic Knot Tying?" by Matthew B. Burn, Heidi L. Holtorf, Kevin M. Smith, Derek T. Bernstein, Domenica A. Delgado, Nickarr Prudhomme, Michael T. Deavers, Patrick C. McCulloch, and Associate Editor, Joshua D. Harris.¹¹ This article represents an outstanding example of translational research, where a basic science investigation is directly applicable or "translates" to arthroscopic patient care. The finalists are noted in Table 3.

Finally, we have 2 additional categories: Most Downloaded Publication and Most Cited Publication. This year, as last, we selected from articles published 5 years before to allow for a true gauge of citations; this year, it is articles from 2012. The winner of the Most Downloaded Publication Award is the work of Marsha Tijssen, Robert van Cingel, Linn Willemsen, and Enrico de Visser, "Diagnostics of Femoroacetabular Impingement and Labral Pathology of the Hip: A Systematic Review of the Accuracy and Validity of Physical Tests."¹⁶ Physical diagnosis remains a hot topic 5 years later.^{17,18} Further finalists are listed in Table 4.
