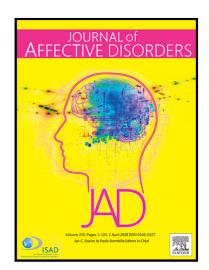

Highlights

- Depression in fathers during the postnatal period can negatively affect all members of the family
- Mothers but not fathers are routinely screened for depression in the postnatal period
- This study shows that it is cost-effective to screen fathers for depression in the postnatal period
- Child health nurses should be key medical personnel to routinely screen fathers for postnatal depression
