

## Highlights

- Costs related to adolescent depression have only been calculated based on rough estimations.
- Clinically referred adolescents cost the Dutch society annually almost €38 million.
- Using a more recent, international prevalence rate, the costs in the Netherlands augmented to €59 million a year.
- The magnitude of costs warrants effective prevention and intervention programs but this should be examined with cost-effectiveness studies.
