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Highlights

- A nationally representative sample of 5,223 community-living elderly (≥ 60 years).
- Significant interactive effect of depression and chronic disease on health care use.
- Gender moderated association of depression with health care use in chronically ill.
- Self-rated health mediated the association of depression with health care use.
- The mediation by self-rated health was moderated by gender and chronic disease.

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
