**Highlights**

- Irritability is a promising transdiagnostic predictor for mental health, including suicide-related outcomes
- Community-based studies suggested an association between irritability and suicidality
- Studies in clinical samples reported mixed findings
- Poor evidence linked irritability and suicide mortality
- A major limitation is the heterogeneity in the definition and measurement of irritability
