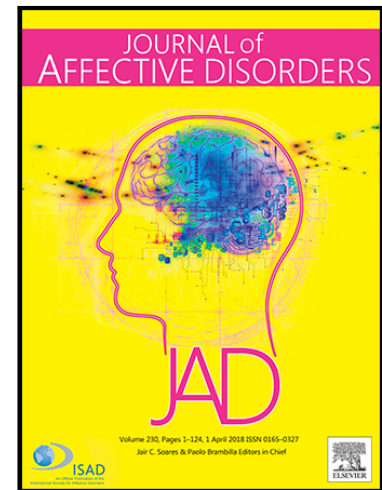


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Comorbid Depressive and Anxiety Symptoms and the Risk of Type 2 Diabetes: Findings from the Lifelines Cohort Study

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Highlights

- A subtype of depression characterized by comorbid anxiety was examined as a risk factor of diabetes
- Depression with comorbid anxiety was associated with an increased risk of incident diabetes
- Depression without anxiety was not significantly associated with incident diabetes

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
