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The Association between Severity of Depression and Prescription Opioid Misuse among Chronic Pain Patients with and Without Anxiety: a Cross-sectional Study


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Highlights

- We compared prevalence of prescription opioid misuse among chronic pain patients
- Odds for misuse were compared across different levels of severity of depression
- More than 80% of all participants screened positive for some level of depression
- Misuse was 14 times more common among those with severe, compared to no, depression
- Severity of depression contributed to misuse regardless of severity of anxiety

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
