Highlights

- Suicide-specific rumination (SSR) and ASAD have each been linked to suicide attempts (SA).
- This study examined ASAD as an indirect indicator of the relation between SSR and SAs.
- ASAD accounted for the association between SSR and lifetime SAs, but not vice versa.
- This effect was particularly driven by the suicidal intent component of ASAD.
