ABSTRACT**Background:**

Intimate partner violence (IPV) and mental disorders (MD) are important public health problems disproportionately affecting women. We aimed to study the epidemiology of IPV victimization, MD, and co-occurring IPV-MD in Spanish men and women in terms of i) prevalence, ii) association between IPV and MD, and iii) sociodemographic and clinical characteristics associated with IPV, MD, and co-occurring IPV-MD.

Methods:

Community-based cross-sectional study with 4,507 randomly selected participants.

Measurement instruments (Mini International Neuropsychiatric Interview and set of validated questions about IPV during the last 12 months) were administered by trained
