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Does the acromiohumeral distance matter in chronic rotator cuff related shoulder pain?

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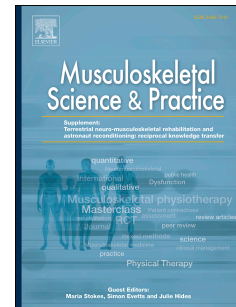
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
