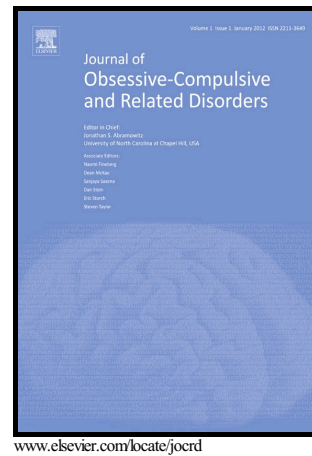

Abstract

A lack of cognitive confidence, defined as a distrust of one's attention, perception and memory, may be implicated in obsessive-compulsive disorder (OCD) and could account for
